

Police

- According to the 2003 Clearwater Citizen Survey, 92% of citizens surveyed indicated that Clearwater is a safe place to live.
- Operation Apoyo Hispano, the department's award-winning Hispanic outreach enterprise is a model program for jurisdictions serving minority populations.
- In partnership with Traffic Engineering, designed and implemented "Operation Speed Watch" as an interim measure for traffic calming in selected neighborhoods throughout the city. Survey results showed a significant decrease in traffic concerns this past year.
- Expanded Citizen Police Academy and Volunteer programs to include Homeland Security Patrol and Clearwater Recreational Trail programs.
- In partnership with the City of Largo, implemented "Hands Across the Border," a new Mutual Aid Agreement allowing officers of either agency to investigate traffic crashes and issue tickets in border areas.
- Opened new police substation on Clearwater Beach at 700 Bayway Blvd.
- Increased ability to respond to a weapons of mass destruction incident through threat assessment, strategy development, grant preparation, equipment acquisition, and participating in training exercises related to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, Urban Area Security Initiative program.
