- Continued construction of the new high-span Memorial Causeway Bridge, which will provide a safer and more efficient connection between the beach and downtown. Travel lanes will open Spring 2004.
- Constructed Town Lake park and retention facility in Downtown Clearwater.
- Completed streetscaping projects on Mandalay and Martin Luther King Jr. Avenues.
- Completed Grandview Terrace traffic calming as part of the city's ongoing traffic management efforts.
- Opened reverse osmosis water treatment plant to reduce reliance on other water sources.
- Started design of Kapok Wetland and Floodplain project as well as design of Glen Oaks Stormwater Management Area.
- Recognized as Tree City USA for more than 20 years.
- Continued expansion of reclaimed water system in Harbor Oaks and Union Street areas with a goal to reach completion in fiscal year 2004.
- Recognized nationally by the Innovations Group for management program *Each One, Teach One*.
