- Involved with 44,624 total preventative actions including: 45 swimming assists, 15,209 swimmers violating swim zone line, 1,070 boaters violating swim zone lines, 2,917 jetty violations, 214 missing person assists, 1,899 first aid assists, 1,370 Pier 60 violations, and 21,900 code enforcement issues.
- Improved internal operations including implementing new software for slip rentals, revised department standards documents, drafted Marina Master Plan, and maintained and tracked performance measures.
- Held first tenants meeting and planned and hosted Open House/Neighborhoods Day at Clearwater Airpark. More than 2,000 people attended.
- Received FDOT grant for new Fixed Base Operator building at Clearwater Airpark.
- Replaced and repaired bad decking throughout the marina and installed new handicapped-accessible lift at fuel dock.
- Repeated as United States Lifeguard Association Southeast Region Champs at tournament in Cocoa Beach, making it three out of the last four as champions of our region.

Clearwater's Airpark was originally three grass runways in the 1940s. Today, Clearwater Airpark is a single paved runway facility on a 47-acre site currently operating as a general aviation airport. The airpark is a vital link in transporting donated organs, providing the gift of life.
