Clearwater was incorporated in 1891. James Crane, a schoolteacher, was the town of Clearwater's first mayor. In 1920, the city had \$461,000 in total assets, compared to more than \$832 million in 2004.

ACCOMPLISHMENTS FOR INTERNAL AUDIT

- Ten Revenue Audits recovered \$236,801 due to the City that will produce an additional \$120,000 in annual recurring revenue. Provided about \$250,000 in additional revenue for the city in Fiscal Year 2006/07 from five years of prior revenue audits.
- Twenty Program Audits resulted in 60 recommendations with potential program savings of \$300,000.
- Provided written and verbal Spanish-language translations, municipal services information in Spanish, and assistance with local social service partnerships to our growing Hispanic-Latino population, which is approximately 20,000 or 18% of Clearwater's population.

Verified cash handling procedures city wide. Complied with city policy to ensure proper collecting, recording, and depositing of payments received; investigated ongoing usage of purchasing cards per city policy to maximize purchasing efficiency, thereby reducing the reliance on paying with cash and checks.
