Airpark Advisory Board	1 <sup>st</sup> Wed. (Feb, May, Aug, Nov.) 3:00 p.m. 5 members, 4-year terms	Serves in an advisory capacity re monitoring the operation and maintenance of Clearwater Executive Airpark.
Brownfields Advisory Board <sup>1</sup>	As called 9 members, 4-year terms	Receives public comments on the rehabilitation & redevelopment of the Brownfields area, future land use, local employment opportunities, community safety, & environmental justice. Reviews and provides recommendations to the Council re site rehabilitation agreements. Implements the public participation elements outlined in the Federal Brownfields Economic Redevelopment Initiative Work Plan.
Clearwater Housing Authority	4 <sup>th</sup> Friday, 8:30 a.m. 5 members, 4-year terms Financial Disclosure Required	Provides housing and rent subsidies for low to moderate-income families.
Community Development Board <sup>2</sup>	3 <sup>rd</sup> Tuesday, 1:00 p.m. 7 members and 1 alternate 4-year terms Financial Disclosure Required	Handles matters related to planning and development. Conducts public hearings and decides certain development requests that are not within discretion of city staff. Conducts design review, evaluates historic applications, reviews requests for land use plan changes and rezonings, serves as Local Planning Agency to review and advise Council re the City's Comprehensive Plan.

<sup>1</sup> Special qualifications: Three members shall be Clearwater residents who live within or adjacent to the Brownfields area; three members shall be owners or representatives of businesses operating in the proposed area and need not be residents of Clearwater; three members shall be representatives of federal or state agencies or local governments involved with the Brownfields remediation process within Pinellas County and need not be Clearwater residents.

<sup>2</sup> Special qualifications: Four members shall be qualified and experienced in the fields of architecture, planning, landscape architecture, engineering construction, planning and land use law and real estate.

Environmental Advisory Board	3 <sup>rd</sup> Wednesday, 4:00 p.m. 5 members, 4-year terms	Identifies and assesses environmental objectives, provides citizen input to Council.
Enterprise Zone Development Agency <sup>3</sup>	As called. 8-13 members, 4-year terms	Assists in the development and implementation of the strategic plan for the area; oversees and monitors the implementation of the strategic plan for the area; identifies and recommends to the Council ways to remove regulatory barriers and identifies the financial needs of, and local resources or assistance available to, eligible businesses in the area.
Library Board	2 <sup>nd</sup> Thursday, 10:30 a.m. No meetings in June, July, or August 7 members, 4-year terms	Serves as advisory to Library Director and Council in all matters pertinent to policies governing the operations and programs of the Library System.
Marine Advisory Board	2 <sup>nd</sup> Wednesday, 8:00 a.m. 7 members, 4-year terms	Makes recommendations regarding the City's Marina and waterways.
Municipal Code Enforcement Board <sup>4</sup>	4 <sup>th</sup> Wednesday Jan.-Oct., 3:00 p.m. Nov and Dec Meetings TBA 7 members, 3-year terms Financial Disclosure Required	Conducts hearings regarding enforcement of fire, occupational license, building, zoning, sign, and related City codes.
Neighborhood & Affordable Housing Advisory Board <sup>5</sup>	As called. 7 members, 4-year terms	Reviews, monitors and evaluates City programs directed to improving the environment and lifestyle of low to moderate income people; makes recommendations to the City Manager and Council.
Parks and Recreation Board	4 <sup>th</sup> Tuesday, 6:30 p.m. 7 members, 4-year terms	Advises the City on the condition, improvements and development of property for parks and recreation facilities.

<sup>3</sup> Categories represented: local Chamber of Commerce, local financial or insurance entities, business operating in the area, resident residing within the area, non-profit community based organization operating within the area, local private industry council, City of Clearwater Community Response Team, and Police Department.

<sup>4</sup> Special qualifications (whenever possible): Shall include an architect, businessperson, engineer, general contractor, sub-contractor and realtor.

<sup>5</sup> Special qualifications: Shall include one member in each: residential building industry, banking/mortgage industry, labor, advocate for low income housing, provider for low income housing, real estate industry, resident N. Greenwood area, resident S. Greenwood area, and resident East Clearwater area.

Public Art and Design Advisory Board <sup>6</sup>	TBD each year 7 members, 4-year terms	Develops guidelines, procedures and policies to administer the Public Art and Design Program.
Sister Cities Advisory Board <sup>7</sup>	TBD each year 5 members, 4-year terms	Makes recommendations for the effective functioning of Sister Cities activities and advises the City Council of Sister Cities program issues that might impact the expansion of development of the program

<sup>6</sup> Special qualifications: The Public Art and Design Board shall consist of seven members; one member of the Clearwater Arts Foundation, one Pinellas County Arts Council member, or designee, one landscape architect, architect, urban planner, or related design professional, one active professional artist, and three private citizens who are knowledgeable in the field of public art, education, or community affairs. Representatives of the Clearwater Arts Foundation and the Pinellas County Arts Council shall be nominated by their respective organizations. Section 2.063, Code of Ordinances notwithstanding, the Clearwater Arts Foundation and the Pinellas County Arts Council representative shall not be required to reside within the City of Clearwater.

<sup>7</sup> Special qualifications: One member of the city council, a representative of the local business community, the School Board's World Language Coordinator or designee, a Clearwater Sister Cities, Inc. representative, and a Clearwater Arts Foundation representative. Representatives of the Clearwater Sister Cities Inc. and Clearwater Arts Foundation shall be nominated by their respective organizations. Section 2.063, Code of Ordinances notwithstanding, the representatives of the local business community, the School Board's World Language Coordinator or designee, and the Clearwater Arts Foundation representative shall not be required to reside within the City of Clearwater.
